Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We have had a good year raising £8,412.00 (excluding 150 club and gift aid contributions) and before paying for contribution to the pantomime.

The 150 club provided an additional £1954.00 of profit after sharing the prize money with the winning members.

We have also received gift aid contributions for the Sponsored Events totalling £1757.00.

We had strong support at our events from parents and friends of St Mary's.

The Christmas period again was a very busy one and proved to be successful raising £1281.00 in one month alone!. The Ladies Christmas party was a well attended and enjoyable evening, raising £335.00. The Christmas cards raised £260.00 and the raffle a huge £686.00.

The race night was changed this year to Pig Racing with battery operated Pigs, we also had a bar this year which was a success and the night raised £684.00.

This year we held two sponsored events which were a pancake flip and bounce, these continue to be our biggest fund raiser each year. These two events raised a fantastic £2532.00. This amount excludes any gift aid monies still to be claimed.

The gift aid applications for the sponsored events will be submitted next month.

St Mary's held their third bake off competition. This proved to be very popular again amongst the children and some amazing creations were brought into school to be judged by Oldham's Youth Mayor TJ Turner. We made it into the Evening Chronicle again. This event raised £337.00.

We held 3 school discos, Trick or Treat (£461.00), Valentine (£442.00) and Summer (£554.00). Combined these raised £1457.00. These continue to be an exciting and popular event for the children.

Raffles. We had 3 raffles throughout the year. Christmas, Easter and Summer. These combined raised £1441.00. The Christmas raffle was our biggest fund raiser at £686.00.

We held a Church coffee morning and also sold coffee at the assemblies in church totalling £321.00.

The Bags2School collections raised £236.00. These amounts have dropped significantly over the last couple of years due to the new restrictions in place. However, I feel it is still a good amount for minimal effort.

We have continued to push the use of the easyfundraising website. We have received contributions of £446.00 this financial year (£2,240 since we launched approximately 6 years ago). This amount is with only 53 members. I feel this is something that needs to be advertised on a regular basis to encourage people to sign up. I feel certain this could easily generate over £1,000 annually.
