Dear Parents, Children & Friends,

Welcome back to the brand-new school year!

It has been a difficult return to school with the number of positive cases we have seen. My sincere thanks for all the support and co-operation you have shown over these difficult few weeks. This week the number of cases have certainly settled and we are currently seeing just isolated cases.

After speaking with Oldham Public Health today they are happy for St Mary's to attempt to return to some of their usual activities and procedures.

Therefore, from Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September Year 2 can join their friends on the playground and come into school and leave school in the usual way. Reception can also reintegrate with school once more.

We will slowly reintroduce whole school worship. This initially will be for pupils in school only. We will also slowly reintroduce some of our extra curricular activities. This will begin with our School Choir taster session on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> September 3:30 - 4:30pm and School Band Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> September 8:30 - 9:00am ( Children to arrive at 8:20am using the infant entry please).

The current advice to all schools from Oldham Public Health is:

**Although there are 3 main symptoms of COVID – 19, unfortunately, there is no definitive list of secondary symptoms which some people experience.**

**The advice given to schools is that if there is a change in how a person is feeling, or if they feel generally unwell, then taking a PCR test is advisable.**

### YEAR 6 APPLICATION TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS:

How you apply for a place at secondary school depends on where you live. The application has to be made to the Local Authority in which you live. Please see below for further details.

#### **Oldham Residents:**

If your child is due to start secondary school in September 2022. This is a very exciting and important time. Please note how and when you need to apply and where to access information to guide you through this process.

**You will need to complete an application using the online application system available on the Oldham Council website.** It's quick and easy and ensures school offers can be made efficiently via e-mail. Applying on line is the only form of application as Oldham Council no longer provides paper application forms.

The online system will open on **1 August 2021** and close at **5pm on 31 October 2021**.

*There is a new secondary school opening for September 2022. If you wish to apply for the Brian Clarke CE Academy all applications for that academy **must** go directly to the academy, not via the council's processes. If you are subsequently offered a place at the new academy you will then have a choice as to whether to accept your offer from the council **OR** the offer from Brian Clarke CE Academy. The deadline to apply for this school is **10 December 2021**. Please visit [Brian Clarke CE Academy](#) for more details on the school and their admissions process.*

There is a recommendation that a **minimum** of three preferences are made for any application. Families can apply for Brian Clarke **and** still apply via the council website for all other schools.

If you don't have access to the internet, there are computers in all Oldham's libraries. You will need an email address, these are very easy to set up and staff will be happy to help.

For faith schools you will need to fill in a supplementary form or provide documentation in addition to the application. Supplementary forms are available from, and returned to, the relevant school.

To enable you to have a look at what is on offer, all Oldham secondary schools will be holding open evenings during the autumn term. You will be able to access further information, a guide and links to school websites by logging onto [www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions](http://www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions)

The closing date for all Oldham Council applications is 5pm **31 October 2021**. Any application received after this time will be classed as late and will not be processed until all the on time applications have been allocated a school place.

**You will need to complete an application using the online application system available on the Oldham Council website [www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions](http://www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions)** It's quick and easy and means you get the school offer directly via email. You can find more information, a guide, and links to school websites here too. The online system opened on **1 September 2021**.

**In addition, any parent wishing to apply for a Reception place at St. Mary's CE Primary School MUST complete a supplementary form (available from the school office or download from the school website).**

If you don't have access to the internet at home, there are computers in all Oldham's libraries. You will need an email address, but these are very easy to set up and staff will be happy to help.

**Deadlines for making an application: Primary 15<sup>th</sup> January 2022 at 5pm**
