



Grow the code grapheme mat Phase 2, 3 and 5







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Reading

We want children to love reading

Reading should be enjoyable



Learning to read should be a positive experience

We want children to read for pleasure

Reading underpins children's access to the curriculum and clearly impacts on their achievement



How we teach reading

Reading practice sessions are: Books are:

Timetabled 3 times a week

Taught by trained teacher or teaching assistant

Taught in small groups

matched to children's secure phonic knowledge and word reading


read three times

sent home

Reading Practice Books carefully matched so children can read fluently and independently

3 Reads – each one begins with some quick sounds and words practice

- 1. Decoding
- 2. Prosody (intonation, expression)
- 3. Comprehension



When children take their book home to read they should be 95% fluent Please do not worry that a book is too easy – your child needs to develop fluency and confidence in reading. Re-reading a book they have had before helps develop fluency – this is the goal.

Celebrate their success!!!

How will this work?


Children are assessed, then LW matches which books Should be allocated for their secure phonic knowledge

Children will have access to their Reading Practice Book at home electronically (after physically reading the book 3 times in school). Teachers will let you know the days books go home and when they need to be in school to be changed. Initially this will be Fridays for all Year 1 pupils.


Celebrate, praise, talk about the book with you child.

Please make sure books are in book bags so that we can reallocate books as required.

Big Cat Collins Reading books are carefully matched to children's **secure** phonic knowledge




Sharing Book

Children may also bring home a 'sharing book' if appropriate. This is an extra book. The reading practice ebook is the key home reading book.

To become lifelong readers, it is essential that they read for pleasure

Children may not be able to read this book independently but these books offer a wealth of opportunities for talking about the pictures and enjoying the story or information text.

Enjoy the book together foster a love of reading "pair and share"

The year 1 phonics screening check

The check will take place in a week long window in June 2022

The check must be administered by a teacher

The purpose of the Y1 screening check

 To confirm that all pupils have learned phonic decoding to an age appropriate standard

 To identify pupils who have not reached this level and implement appropriate intervention

The structure of the check

- Practice words
- 20 real words and 20 pseudo words
- All two syllable words will be real words e.g. shampoo, windmill, sandpit
- All letters will be lower case
- Schools will be able to modify font, font size and format

How will the results of the phonics screening check be used?

- Individual results will be made available to parents
- Results will be made available to Ofsted inspectors
- Results will not be published in performance tables
- There will be a report on national results to track standards over time
- National and local authority results will be reported to allow schools to benchmark the performance of their pupils
