#### EASTER SERVICE:

## CURRICULUM UPDATE:

Here are just some of the highlights from our learning this term:

### Reception

The Reception class enjoyed making and eating pancakes this term. They have also been painting daffodils - learning how to mix lighter and darker colours. Whilst painting the daffodils, Reception children were encouraged to enjoy a moment of stillness - a 'now' moment - and appreciate the colours and beauty of the flowers they were observing and creating.

















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Year 1 have been studying poetry and thoroughly enjoyed performing their poem. In RSHE Year 1 have been talking about their emotions and what makes us happy.





Year 2
Pupils have been finding out about

oceans and continents. They had great fun making their balloon globes! They have also visited St Mary's church to learn about why the church is a special place for Christians.







Year 3

Year 3 have been historians this term. They have travelled back in time and become archaeologists like Howard Carter, re-enacting the discovery of Tutankhamun's Tomb. They will continue their learning and discovery about the Egyptians at Bolton Museum next term.

















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### Year 4

Year 4 have been thinking about trust in their RE lessons. Here the children are playing games, such as trust falls, conscience alley and trust directions all of which involve trusting one another. This has helped the children to understand who Jesus could trust and who betrayed him.







## Year 5

Year 5 have been deepening their knowledge and understanding of the Vikings after they had a visitor for the day. The photograph shows a fire demonstration which was a highlight for pupils.



## Year 6

As part of their science learning about light, Year 6 enjoyed a wonderful lesson delivered by Oldham 6th Form College. They also had the opportunity to make their own periscopes (and got to spy on the Head

Teacher as well!)















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### **EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS:**

External assessments include: Phonics in Yr1, Phonics resits in Yr2, Times Table Check in Yr 4 and SATs in Yr6. Please be assured that all of the above assessments are carried out in a safe and supportive environment. To reduce unnecessary pressure on our younger children, the assessments are presented as activities and 'special work'. Children, in all relevant classes, are already familiar with these types of activities and guestions from work completed in class.

Year Six SATS are a more formal series of test papers; however, school staff can make reasonable adjustments in line with the guidance, where appropriate. This year's Y6 SATs will take place from Monday13th May -Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May 2024. Please make every effort to avoid booking any holidays or appointments during this period. Full attendance is essential. Year 6 will be invited into school early on these days for toast and juice, allowing them time to socialise and settle. We will send more details closer to the time. We will also be arranging an end-of-the-week afternoon treat in recognition of all their hard work - details to follow.

### STAFFING NEWS:

I am delighted to share the news that Mrs Hepworth is expecting her second child. Mrs Hepworth will be with us until the end of the academic year, her baby is due in August. Mrs Hepworth will then take the following year as Maternity Leave.

The Governors are working closely with me to recruit a temporary Year 5 teacher and a SENDco whilst Mrs Hepworth is on Maternity Leave. Once arrangements are finalised I will share this with you.

### ATTENDANCE:

Good attendance is of great importance for all our pupils and something we celebrate at the end of each term with badges presented to individual pupils.

Each month on the school newsletters we will also celebrate great attendance by class.

The class with the highest attendance this month is Year 3 with 97% attendance!

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### LIVING OUT OUR CHRISTIAN VISION:

Many of these are seen each and every day in the way pupils and staff interact with one another. Further examples are shared through the citizenship challenges. Here pupils have made special cards for neighbours, the elderly and those in care homes. They have thought about the environment and reminded adults at home about the importance of recycling. They continue to raise money for charities of significance to their families.

These actions have all been carried out without the expectation of reward, but instead with joy and compassion for others.

Throughout the term, with the support of the clergy, we have explored the Christian value of humility as one of the values which help us live out our core value: Love Ourselves.

Mother Katy and Father Paul have continued to lead Circle time where pupils have had time to reflect on the story of Jesus washing the disciples' feet and consider how we too can be humble.

Next half term, our Christian Value and focus for Worship is Respect.
